
Sermon Based Small Group Questions

Opening

1. Think back to the last funeral you attended. What thoughts and emotions did you experience at that event?

Going Deeper

Read 1 1 Corinthians 15:1-18

- 1. In our passage, Paul is addressing Christians who have been shaped by their culture, and as a result have begun to doubt the resurrection. How is this relevant today?
- 2. How does Paul seek to build confidence in Jesus' resurrection in verse 3-8?
- 3. Imagine yourself talking to a friend or co-worker who is skeptical about Christianity. If you had a chance to explain why you believe in the resurrection, what would you say?
- 4. In verses 12-19, Paul outlines 4 particular consequences for believers if Jesus did not rise from the dead.
 - a. What are they?
 - b. Which of these hits closest to home for you?
- 5. There is often a lot of fear and speculation that surrounds end time events. What comes your mind as you envision Christ's return?

- 6. What does verse 23-26 teach us about the end time events? How does this encourage you?
- 7. In Corinth, people were not only doubting the resurrection, they were asking the practical question of how our bodies can be raised back to life.
 - a. What do we learn about the resurrection of our bodies in verse 35-54?
 - b. What will be different about our resurrected bodies? What will be the same?
- 8. Paul's discussion of the resurrection finishes on a very practical note in verse 58. How do these words encourage you?
