
## **Sermon Based Small Group Questions**

Read Mark 10:23-27

- 1. What stands out to you in this story?
- 2. The rich young ruler asks the question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?"
  - a. What insight is there in his question?
  - b. How does he get the question wrong?
  - c. Jesus never explicitly states the one thing this man lacked. What is it?
- 3. In verse 23-24 Jesus highlights how hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God. What are the particular difficulties or challenges that wealth brings into our lives?
  - a. Which of these do you most identify with in your own life?

- b. Dietrich Bonhoeffer highlights how modern Christians who read this story are quick to qualify and nuance Jesus hard hitting words about wealth. What does this say about us?
- c. Beyond just giving his money away, what is Jesus asking the rich young ruler to do?
- 4. The most important words in this passage are found in verse 27.
  - a. How are these words good news for us today?
  - b. How would you summarize the main point of this story?
  - c. How has your relationship with Jesus changed your relationship to money?
- 5. Spend a few moments reflecting on this passage as a whole. How do you sense Christ calling you to response?
