1. Many Christians go through seasons where they feel far from Christ. Describe a time in your life where you felt like you were drifting in your faith.

Read Amos 2:4-8

- 1. Often times when we read the Old Testament, we wonder why the Israelites had such a tough time following God. What do you think made the religious life of the nations so appealing to them?
- 2. Eugene Peterson suggests that our post-Christian culture is just as religious as the cultures of the Ancient Near East. Would you agree?
 - a. Where do you see expressions of worship in our culture today?
 - b. What are the most enticing "Baals" for you?
- 3. Our passage suggests that Israel's slide into idolatry wasn't something that happened overnight, but it was a slow drift that took place over many years, even generations. What are some of the unhealthy practices we've inherited from the generation before us?
- 4. Israel's slide into idolatry wasn't just the result of being enticed by foreign idols, but also by rejecting God's instruction. Why do you think they rejected God's instruction?
 - a. What are some ways that Christians today reject God's instruction?
