## Going Deeper

Read Matthew 22:34-40 together

- 1. Why do you think the Pharisees were looking for a way to trip Jesus up? What about his life made them uncomfortable?
- 2. Although Jesus is only asked for 1 answer, he gives them two. Why do you think he does this?
- 3. Reflect on the following quote by Dale Brunner: "Only together in a nurturing mutuality is either love kept pure. A neighbour minimizing love of God is just as reprehensible to Jesus as a God minimizing love of neighbour."
  - a. If you were to err in one of these two directions, which would it be? Why do you think that is?
  - b. If our love of neighbour flows out of our love of God, is it possible to love our neighbour without loving God?
- 4. Jesus' words would have fallen heavily on the ears of the Pharisees, who were known for taking care of their Jewish neighbours but distancing themselves from non-Jewish people. Who are the people you are most prone to keep your distance from? Why?

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- 5. Often times when we read this passage, we can read it without thinking about the neighbours who live around us. Take a few minutes to draw your street or apartment building. Write out the names of your eight closest neighbours.
  - a. Go around the room and share how many names you knew and what you know about them.
  - b. How was this exercise for you? What did it help you see?
  - c. What some practical ways you can love these neighbours? What might it look to move from stranger to acquaintance, or acquaintance to meaningful relationship?
  - d. What small step might God be calling you to make as you consider loving your neighbours?
