Opening

- 1. Share about your BLESS rhythms for this week. (see summary below)
- 2. If someone were to ask you "why are you part of a church," what would say?

Going Deeper

Read Acts 1:1-11

- 1. What is the relationship between Israel in the Old Testament and the church in the New Testament? How are they similar? How are they different?
 - a. In verse 6, Jesus disciples ask him an important question about the kingdom. What does this question reveal about their understanding of the kingdom?
 - b. How does Jesus' response broaden their understanding of the kingdom?
- 2. Jesus tells his disciples that they will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on them. What does this power enable them to do? (see Acts 2:42-47)
 - a. How have you experienced the power of the Holy Spirit? What do you see the Holy Spirit enabling you to do?
- 3. Jesus describes his followers as witnesses. What comes to mind for you as when you think of being a witness?

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4. Read the following quote by Lesslie Newbiggin:

The early Church did not see itself as a private religious society competing with others to offer personal salvation to its members; it saw itself as a movement launched into the public life of the world, challenging the rule of Caesar, claiming the allegiance of all without exception. As a community they rejected the idolatrous claims of their culture and lived their whole lives under the authority of another Lord.

- a. Do you think our culture sees the church in this way?
- b. What might it look like for us to recover this sense of public witness?
- c. After sharing these thoughts, Newbiggin goes on to say that churches that embrace their calling to be a public witness will suffer. Do you think he's right? Why might this be the case?
- 5. There is a lot of talk today about being a missional church. What exactly does it mean to be a missional church?
- 6. As a whole, how does this passage nudge you forward as a follower of Jesus?

BLESS Rhythms Summary:

BLESS: This is the practice of blessing another person. It can be big or small (buying coffee, encouraging text/email, etc.). Who have you blessed this week?

LISTEN: This is the practice of listening, both to God and to others. *How did you set time aside this week to be a listener?*

EAT: This is the practice of sharing food with people. This can happen in a home or in a coffee shop. Who are you eating with/inviting into your home?

SPEAK: This is the practice of speaking our faith. It can happen through encouragement, story sharing, and evangelism. *How have you spoken your faith this week?*

SABBATH: This is the practice of resting from work and taking time to rest and enjoy creation. *How are you practicing Sabbath this week?*
