Opening Questions

- 1. Share a story that lifted your spirits during this time of challenge?
- 2. What helps you face the fear and anxiety?

Going Deeper Questions

- 1. Review all of the last words. Which one resonates with you most right now? Why?
- 2. Read Luke 23:44-46. What strikes you about today's passage?
- 3. Jesus went from 'My God, why have you forsaken me' to '**Father** into your hands I commit my spirit'? What bridged these two phrases? How does that bring us comfort?
- 4. Jesus words are an act of surrender to the will of the Father. How well do you surrender your will? (refer to Luke 9:23-24 and Galatians 2:20 for insight)
- 5. Read Psalm 31:5 and 15 and John 19:10-11. How do these passages make you feel/think? In quoting Psalm 31, what word does Jesus add?
 - a. In what ways are we like Pilate?
 - b. In whose hands are you?
- 6. Read Hebrews 4:16. What is the bases of our confidence?
